ive years ago, the Fresno County Fruit Trail began with a simple idea: Let visitors taste summer fruit harvested from the heart of California. It was a natural fit. Much of the fruit comes from trees on the Fresno County Blossom Trail, the popular springtime tour of flowering orchards. The Fruit Trail has almost 60 stops—including seasonal produce stands with donut peaches, Chandler strawberries, and Legacy blueberries; shops selling vegetables, olive oil, and nuts; and bed-and-breakfasts. For the best fruit selection, visit between May and September.

SIGHTSEE Wiebe Farms ① offers rides through its peach, plum, and nectarine orchards, and visits to the farm store. 5351

At **Simonian Farms' store** ②, a steam shovel and other antiques attract visitors as much as the farm's 120 varieties of fruits and vegetables, including apricots, quinces, and figs. Corner of Clovis and Jensen avenues, Fresno. (559) 237-2294; simonianfarms.com.

River Valley Berry Farm Store 3 offers blueberries, blackberries, and boysenberries, and tours of its fields and packing shed. 39771 Road 28, Kingsburg. (559) 897-0963.
